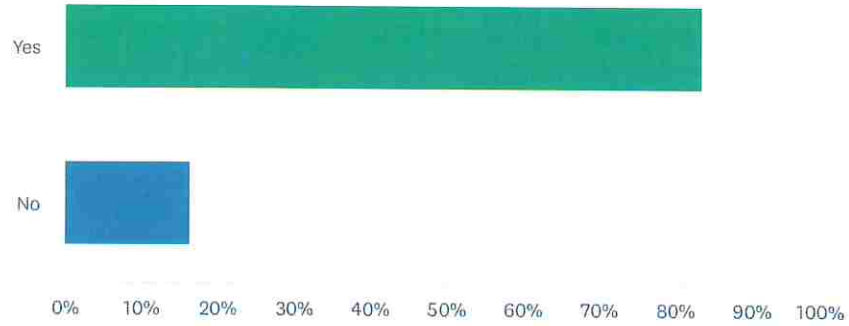


Christmas Concert Feedback

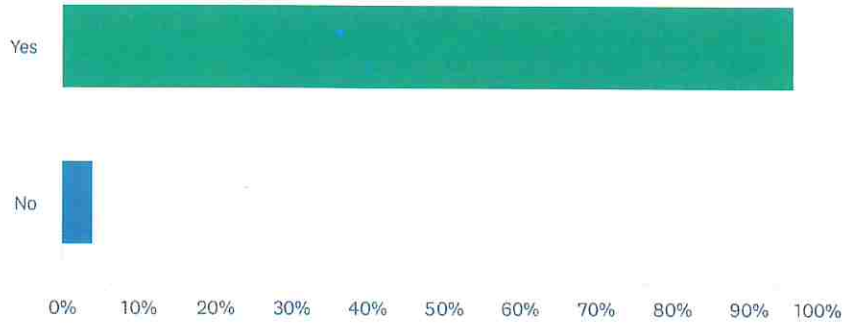

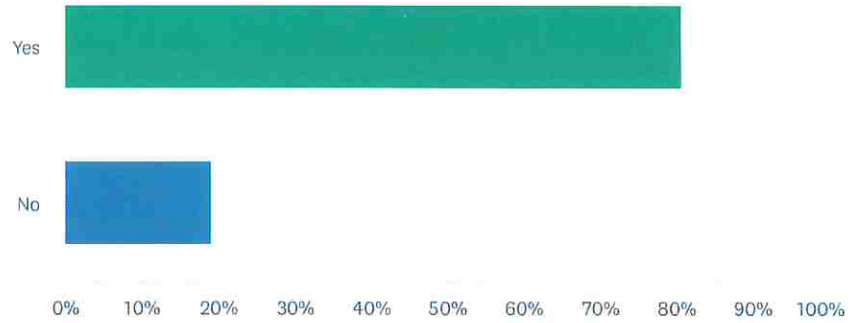

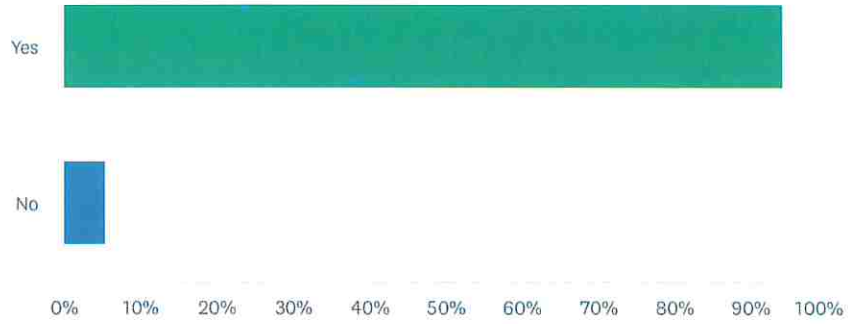

Prefer it outdoors as it feels more Christmassy but liked the option of being indoors instead of cancelling

I think the concert worked well inside, I think the voices of the children carried better. People moved to the back when there children were not performing. One thing that could be better organised was the children on the stage and having the taller children at the back.

Thank you for rehearsing these songs with the children and for organising the event.

I thought that the concert was brilliant my only feedback was that it may have worked even better if the children were staggered - maybe on the stage on the floor? or seated on the edge of the stage some parents struggled to see their children. I can see there may also been a potential problem on the last song when the reception children joined the year 6. As a year 6 mother this would potentially be the last time I'm ever going to see my son sing Christmas songs so I didn't rotate around like for the other years for other parents to come forward to see their reception children.

I think it worked well because it was at different times for each year group. I watched my child and then left to allow room for others to watch theirs.

Didn't mind indoors or outdoors.

It was nice to see the students on stage and much easier to hear them in the hall. However, it was quite cramped in there which was a little uncomfortable. Perhaps parents could be encouraged to rotate to the back if it is not their child in the next song. Or perhaps stagger the carols with bigger breaks. It is difficult I understand that parents may have more than 1 child in the school.

It would be great if, between year groups, someone could say which year group was coming in and encourage parents without a child in that year group to move back to allow a better view for those with a child in that year.

It was good just being invited to see my daughter's class. As much as it's lovely I don't have time with work to watch each class perform.

Having the timings for classes so we could come just for the classes with our children worked well especially with work commitments so we didn't need to stay for whole event

I love that each class got their moment, I'll be honest last year we could neither see nor hear much of it. This year we got to enjoy all of it

I would love to see my child's year only with the parents for that year. With other year groups' parents in the hall waiting for their child in another year the noise was distracting.

It would be useful if the event was after lunch, this would enable working parents to only take a half day off work instead of a whole. The event taking place after lunch would also mean it ties in with the official end of the day, rather than some children having to go back in for lunch.

I thought the Nativity was great & it was clear all the children worked really hard learning all the songs. However, I have heard that in the afternoon the children were very tired during the second performance. Having two performances on the same day might have been abit much for their age group to cope with.

I would of preferred seating and maybe did a couple classes a day

Was just a bit too hot in the hall. Perhaps space the timings out a bit too, but I appreciate you were trying to make the indoor event fit when you had expected it to be outdoors

Loved the Nativity for Reception. Many schools do it up to year 2 - please consider extending it to more year groups- appreciate they are hard work but they are great for child development and very much appreciated by the parents.

I think you may need to stagger the times a little more between year groups.

Much better for children to do a session in the hall, than be outside for 2 hours. loved it this year

I loved the end part with year 6/reception 😊

Loved that each class had their opportunity to perform and that all the children were involved Despite the need to change the venue at the last minute everything went really well Congratulations to all involved looking forward to next years!

I have a child in Y5 and Y3. The Y5 child has done 1 school performance in Reception and my Y3 has done absolutely none. Each has done only one class assembly in which my Y3 spoke 3 words! School performances aren't there just for the parents, it helps children to develop public speaking, memory recall and confidence skills. Since when was the world only about reading and maths? School performance provide skills to enable confidence for interviews, to give a presentation or be able to communicate outside of just written form. Covid is no longer a reasonable excuse to not have children engage in public performance. It's terrible that children are not provided enough access to performing arts in some way. Not sure how the school can justify it

The children in my son's year sang 3 songs but my son was at the back behind a tall child the whole time so I couldn't see him. Also, as all parents were standing it was difficult to see. We preferred the event in doors with an allocated time slot for each year, but could some seating be provided for parents; could the children swap rows for their second song (i.e. those on the second row move to the front) so all parents get the chance to see their child sing.

We loved the Christmas Concert and the communication was faultless and very well organised on the morning of the event!

I was a bit upset my son in year 1 hasn't been given the opportunity to do a Christmas nativity, there wasn't one last year for reception but there was this year reception. He has missed out on all nativity at preschool due to covid restrictions it would of been nice for them to have that opportunity

I really enjoy the Christmas concert. I think having it indoors was easier from a planning perspective (i.e. you aren't at the mercy of the weather), although it does have a nicer feel when the whole school is performing together, so overall I think it's swings and roundabouts as to which is the best option.

Maybe it would have been better to only have parent for the year group performing to be allowed in. Chairs or bench for the front would have been nice

I enjoy the concert and the indoor option was a great way for the children to perform due to the rain, but if the weather permits it is great to have the whole school perform together outdoors. However, if there is scope for change, I'd love the children to have the chance to take part in an end of term nativity-style show.

I only say there wasn't space to see my child because I arrived at 10.55 and only caught the last song, I am quite short so it would have been better to be at the front

It is nice to have the whole school concert outside if the weather is good enough but maybe it could be a bit shorter especially if it is cold. Each year could do a song plus a whole school song and the story telling. I don't like the collection arrangements though as most children go home after the concert if their parents can take them so very few stay for lunch and it makes them feel sad that they've not been taken home. The indoor concert was a great alternative and done well. But maybe the space directly in front of the stage could be coned off so people have to stand at the back of the hall because then more people can see. With them all singing at different times, the early pick up works even less well as you may have to drop children at school, then come back for short performance, then return for early pick up (as opposed to after lunch pick up), which is a bit disjointed. Maybe the school performance could be straight after lunch and the children come away straight after? It would cut down on the return trips.

My child was stood on the smaller stage and right at the back so I don't get to see him sing at all. Shame as it was his last Christmas in ac school. Maybe kids could have rotated half way through to give everyone a chance of being seen. Thought event was lovely though and worked well. Thank you.

Felt it wasn't needed on top of the reception nativity and all the reception kids looked exhausted. Wouldn't have stayed for everyone's song as was so hot and cramped inside the hall so was a bit of a faff for one song :-)

Would be good to have a rotation, as many adults stayed after their year group and many people on the later sessions got stuck at the back and couldn't see their children. E.g once seen your child move to back and allow next year group the front rows etc

This event would be much better if not held on the last day which then results in an even earlier finish time which is only circulated at the last minute. Option to view from home would be ideal like we did in covid times. Can staff make sure all children are visible, mine was stood behind much taller children so couldn't be seen despite me having a good view point. Can children have more time to practice songs, always seems rather last minute.

Not every child is happy to take part in the concert and perform in front of a crowd. There needs to be other options of roles for these children so that they can still be included. At present they either don't come to school which means they miss the last day with friends or they come but are anxious and upset during the performance. The school needs to work towards better inclusivity

Would have been easier to see our child if the first row sit on bottoms middle row kneel and back row stand . Couldn't see either of my kids sing at all

Super gutted as although I had a mare that morning with the car etc and got there later than I'd of liked. I got there at 10.02 and my sons year was coming off the stage. I can only assume it started early? Because the amount of songs I was told they did should surely of lasted more than 2 minutes!!
